The Commonwealth Director of Public Prosecutions, who prosecutes in this behalf for Her Majesty the Queen, INFORMS THE COURT AND CHARGES THAT between about the 1<sup>st</sup> day of December 2012 and the 31<sup>st</sup> day of May 2013 at Canberra in the Australian Capital Territory and elsewhere, BERNARD JOSEPH EDWARD COLLAERY did conspire with a person known to him as Witness K to communicate information or matter to the Government of Timor-Leste, that was prepared by or on behalf of the Australian Secret Intelligence Service in connection with its functions or related to the performance by the Australian Secret Intelligence Service of its functions, which information or matter had come to the knowledge of the person known as Witness K by reason of his being, or having been, a staff member of the Australian Secret Intelligence Service, and the communication was not to be made:

- (1) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member; or
- (2) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in accordance with a contract, agreement or arrangement; or
- (3) by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member or agent, within the limits of authority conferred on the person by the Director-General: or
- (4) with the approval of the Director-General or of a staff member having the authority of the Director-General to give such an approval;

contrary to section 11.5 of the *Criminal Code* (Cth) and section 39 of the *Intelligence Services Act 2001* (Cth).

AND FURTHER THAT on or about the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December 2013 in the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Canberra in the Australian Capital Territory and elsewhere, BERNARD JOSEPH EDWARD COLLAERY communicated information to Emma Alberici on ABC Television Lateline and others obtaining access to the content of the broadcast, that was prepared by or on behalf of the Australian Secret Intelligence Service in connection with its functions or related to the performance by the Australian Secret Intelligence Service of its functions, which information came to BERNARD JOSEPH EDWARD COLLAERY by reason of him having entered into a contract, or agreement or arrangement with the Australian Secret Intelligence Service and the communication was not made:

- (1) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member; or
- (2) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in accordance with a contract, agreement or arrangement; or
- (3) by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member or agent, within the limits of authority conferred on the person by the Director-General; or

AND FURTHER THAT on or about the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of December 2013 in the Kingdom of the Netherlands, Canberra in the Australian Capital Territory and elsewhere, BERNARD JOSEPH EDWARD COLLAERY communicated information to Peter Lloyd of ABC Radio and others obtaining access to the content of the broadcast, that was prepared by or on behalf of the Australian Secret Intelligence Service in connection with its functions or related to the performance by the Australian Secret Intelligence Service of its functions, which information came to BERNARD JOSEPH EDWARD COLLAERY by reason of him having entered into a contract, or agreement or arrangement with the Australian Secret Intelligence Service, and the communication was not made:

- (1) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member; or
- (2) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in accordance with a contract, agreement or arrangement; or
- (3) by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member or agent, within the limits of authority conferred on the person by the Director-General: or

- (1) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member; or
- (2) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in accordance with a contract, agreement or arrangement; or
- (3) by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member or agent, within the limits of authority conferred on the person by the Director-General; or

- (1) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member; or
- (2) to the Director-General or a staff member by the person in accordance with a contract, agreement or arrangement; or
- (3) by the person in the course of the person's duties as a staff member or agent, within the limits of authority conferred on the person by the Director-General; or
- (4) with the approval of the Director-General or of a staff member having the authority of the Director-General to give such an approval;

contrary to section 39 of the Intelligence Services Act 2001 (Cth).
